### When Developing Rubrics - Keep in Mind:

### Two types of Rubrics:

- Holistic Scoring
  - o Provides a single score based on an overall determination of student performance
  - o Assesses a student's response as a whole for the overall quality
  - o Very difficult to calibrate
  - Often multiple evaluators will choose different scores
- Analytic Scoring
  - o Identifies and assesses specific aspects of a response
  - o Multiple Dimensions or Categories are assessed
  - o Provides a logical combination of sub-scores to the overall assigned score.
  - o Much easier to score, less subjective

#### Considerations:

- Does spelling count? Put is in the rubric.
- Avoid words like: many, some, few -instead give a numeric description
- Avoid subjective words: creativity or effort, excellent or inadequate
